Dear Mr. Heck:

On February 7, 2005, World Radio Network, Inc. filed the above-captioned application for authority to operate a Ku-Band Earth Station. This application was filed in response to our letter of January 31, 2005<sup>1</sup> to correct missing information in File No. SES-LIC-20050118-00072. However for the reasons discussed below, we dismiss the application as defective, without prejudice to refiling.

A review of the application reveals that a Radiation Hazard Study was again not submitted.

Accordingly, pursuant to Section 25.112(a) (1)<sup>2</sup> of the Commission's Rules, for failure to provide a Radiation Hazard Study, the application is dismissed.<sup>3</sup>
