Dear Mr. Dow:

On November 14, 2005, Syracuse University filed by paper an application to modify a Ku-Band Transmit/Receive earth station. For the reason discussed below, we dismiss the application as defective, without prejudice to refile.¹

As of November 5, 2004, all filings on Form 312 ("Application for Satellite Space and Earth Station Authorizations") must be submitted electronically through IBFS.
