Dear Mr. Stone:

On February 4, 2005, Barrow Cable TV, Inc. filed the above-captioned application to register a C-Band Receive-only Earth Station. Your application also included a temporary waiver of Section 25.203 and 25.131 of the Commission's Rules regarding the frequency coordination analysis and interference report. For the reasons discussed below, we dismiss the application as defective, without prejudice to refile.¹

A review of the application reveals that you did not submit all required information on FCC Form 312 – Schedule B (E43 – E60).

Because we find that your application is defective, we do not make any determination at this time whether you provided "good cause" for your request for waiver of the Commission's requirement to provide a coordination report at the time you filed your application. If you include a similar waiver request in any future license application, the Division will adopt an Order to consider that request.

Accordingly, pursuant to Section 25.112(a)(1)² of the Commission's Rules, for failure to provide complete answers the application is dismissed.
