PanAmSat Licensee Corp. ("PanAmSat"), at the request of the staff of the International Bureau, herein supplements its above referenced request for Special Temporary Authority ("STA") for 30 days to use its Castle Rock, Colorado Ku-band earth station — call sign KL-92 — to provide launch and early orbit phase ("LEOP") services for the Intelsat 11 satellite that is expected to be launched on October 5, 2007. The LEOP period is expected to last approximately 10 days. <sup>2</sup>

PanAmSat herein confirms that Comsearch has verified that DCI II, Inc. is not operating within the coordination contour of KL-92 and that DCI, II Inc. has given verbal clearance regarding PanAmSat's use of the antenna as proposed by this STA request.
