PanAmSat Licensee Corp. ("PanAmSat"), at the request of the staff of the International Bureau, herein supplements its above referenced request for Special Temporary Authority ("STA") for 30 days to use its Castle Rock, Colorado Ku-band earth station -- call sign KL-92 -- to provide in-orbit testing ("IOT") services at 47.5° W.L. for the Intelsat 11 satellite that is expected to be launched on October 5, 2007.¹

PanAmSat herein confirms that Comsearch has verified that DCI II, Inc. is not operating within the coordination contour of KL-92 and that DCI, II Inc. has given verbal clearance regarding PanAmSat's use of the antenna as proposed by this STA request.
