Hi Jeanette—

As we discussed on the phone earlier, I just noticed in the Daily Digest today that our most recent STA renewal to add the Inmarsat 2F1 satellite was dismissed today as Moot. Specifically, the Digest states,

“SES-STA-20091230-01635 KB34 Vizada, Inc.

Renewal of special temporary authority is dismiss as Moot, due to Inmarsat 2F1 satellite is added to the ISAT List, See Inmarsat plc, IBFS

File Nos. SAT-PPL-20081219-00235 & SAT-APL-20090609-00068 (granted September 8, 2009).”

As I noted on the phone, I believe there is a problem with dismissing this STA as moot. The KB34 license (attached) contains authority for both L-band and C-band frequencies. When we filed to add the Inmarsat 2F1 satellite to our license (File No. SES-MFS-20081029-01425), we expected that the technical parameters would remain the same (i.e. both C-band and L-band frequencies), albeit with an additional point of communication (the 2F1 satellite).

I understand that the ISAT list covers L-band, but not C-band, so we still need authority from the Commission for the KB34 earth stations to communicate with the 2F1 satellite in the C-band, which is what we were asking for in our original modification application (SES-MFS-20081029-01425), put on Public Notice on December 30, 2009.

Please let us know what we can do to remedy this situation and ensure that we have authority for communications with the 2F1 satellite in the C-band.
