Ellenwood, Georgia Earth Station E000048

Dear Ms. Dortch:

Intelsat License LLC (“Intelsat”) herein requests a grant of Special Temporary Authority (“STA”)<sup>1</sup> for 30 days, commencing April 24, 2018, to use its Ellenwood, Georgia Ku-band earth station—Call Sign E000048—to provide communications services to Intelsat 901 (Call Sign S2405) at its permanent location of 29.5° W.L.<sup>2</sup> Intelsat also will be requesting 180 days of STA for this short-term use.

The proposed operations will be performed using the following frequencies: 10950-11200 MHz and 11450-11700 MHz in the downlink; and 14000-14500 MHz in the uplink.

The proposed operations at 29.5° W.L. will be consistent with Intelsat’s coordination agreements for the nominal 29.5° W.L. In the unlikely event that harmful interference occurs, Intelsat will take all necessary steps to eliminate the interference.

Grant of this STA request will allow Intelsat to provide customer services from the 29.5° W.L. orbital location and thereby promotes the public interest.
