Multi-Link Holland is granted Special Temporary Authority for 180 days, commencing April 8, 2021, to operate three Transmit-Only Temporary-Fixed earth station antennas at geographic coordinates 30° 19'19"N, 81° 38' 14.3"W in Jacksonville, FL to communicate with geostationary orbit satellites: SES-1 (Call Sign S2807) at orbital location 101° W, Galaxy19 (Call Sign S2647) at orbital location 97° W, SES-3 (Call Sign S2892) at orbital location 103°W on frequencies 6185 MHz, 6265-6325 MHz, 6365-6425 MHz (Earth-to-space), and 14000-14500 MHz (Earth-to space) under the following conditions:

1. Operations 3.7meter antennas shall be within the C-band frequency coordinated parameters.

2. Multi-Link Holland, shall not cause harmful interference to, and shall not claim protection from, interference caused to it by any other lawfully operating station and it shall cease transmission(s) immediately upon notice of such interference.

4. In the event that there is a report of interference, Multi-Link Holland must immediately terminate transmissions and notify the FCC in writing.

5. This STA is granted with the condition that the licensee shall comply with 47 C.F.R. §25.277, Temporary-Fixed earth station operations, regarding submission of Frequency Coordination Reports prior to commencing operations at any location. Failure to perform successful prior frequency coordination will result in the cancellation of your station license herein. Copies of all coordination notices shall be forwarded to the Federal Communications Commission, FCC Monitoring Station, Director of the Columbia Operations Center, 9200 Farmhouse Lane, Columbia, MD 20146.

6. Earth station antenna must not transmit at elevation angle less than three degrees, measured from the horizontal plane to the direction of maximum radiation; however, it may be necessary to specify greater minimum elevation angles to prevent interference pursuant to 47 C.F.R.§ 25.205(a).

7. The licensee shall take all necessary measures to ensure that the antennas do not create potential exposure of humans to radiofrequency radiation in excess of the FCC exposure limits defined in 47 CFR 1.1307(b) and 1.1310 wherever such exposures might occur. Measures must be taken to ensure compliance with limits for both occupational/controlled exposure and for general population/uncontrolled exposure, as defined in these rule sections. Compliance can be accomplished in most cases by appropriate restrictions such as fencing. Requirements for restrictions can be determined by predictions based on calculations, modeling or by field measurements. The FCC's OET Bulletin 65 (available on-line at www.fcc.gov/oet/rfsafety) provides information on predicting exposure levels and on methods for ensuring compliance, including the use of warning and alerting signs and protective equipment for workers.

8. Any action taken or expense incurred as a result of operations pursuant to this special temporary authority is solely at Multi-Link Holland.
