Nuevo, California Earth Station E060384

Dear Ms. Dortch:

Intelsat License LLC ("Intelsat") herein requests 30 days of Special Temporary Authority ("STA"),¹ commencing January 13, 2023, to use its Nuevo, Ku-band earth station, Call Sign E060384, to conduct in-orbit testing ("IOT") with Galaxy 35 (S3143)² at 150.05° W.L. and Galaxy 36 (S3148)³ at 149.95° W.L. Intelsat expects the IOT to last approximately 15 days for each satellite.

The proposed IOT will be performed at the following frequency bands:

- 12750-13250 MHz and 13750-14500 MHz (uplink); and
- 10700-11200 MHz and 11700-12450 MHz (downlink).⁴

The proposed operations are being coordinated with all operators of satellites that are potentially affected by these operations at the IOT location.⁵ All operators of potentially affected satellites will be provided with an emergency phone number where the licensee can be reached in the event that harmful interference occurs. In the extremely unlikely event that harmful interference should

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occur due to transmissions to or from its earth station, Intelsat will take all reasonable steps to eliminate the interference.

In furtherance of the Federal Communications Commission's goal of clearing 3700-4000 MHz, grant of this STA request will allow Intelsat to help test Galaxy 35 and Galaxy 36 and place the satellites into service, which will provide continuity of service at the 95.05° W.L. and 89.0°W.L. orbital locations, respectively. Grant of this request will thereby promote the public interest.
