Scope of Grant:	DIRECTV Enterprises, LLC ("DIRECTV"), is granted a 30-day special temporary authority (STA), to operate its satellite earth station to provide telemetry, tracking, and command (TT&C) functions to facilitate the deorbiting of the D9S (S2669) satellite, utilizing the existing satellite arc east limit of 70.0° W.L. (with elevation of 32.1° and azimuth of 132.3°) and an extended satellite arc west limit of 162.0° W.L. (with elevation of 16.5° and azimuth of 247.8°).	
Service Area(s):	39° 16' 39.0" N, 104° 48' 25.0" W in Castle Rock, CO	
Frequencies:	Operations will be performed at the following center frequencies: 17.795 GHz (Earth-to-space) 12.6955 GHz (space-to-Earth) 12.6965 GHz (space-to-Earth)	
Operations under this grant must comport with the legal and technical specifications set forth by the applicant or petitioner and with Federal Communication Commission's rules not waived herein. This grant is also subject to the following conditions: 1. STA operations must not exceed the operational power levels and parameters requested and coordinated. 2. STA operations must use the minimum power level necessary to establish communications links in order to minimize potential interference to licensed users. 3. All operations under this grant of STA must be on an unprotected and non-interference basis (NIB), i.e., DIRECTV must not cause harmful interference to and must not claim protection from interference caused to it by any other lawfully operating station. 4. In the event of any harmful interference caused by operations under this grant of STA, DIRECTV must immediately cease operations upon notification of such interference. DIRECTV must immediately inform the Commission, in writing, of such an event. 5. The 24/7 point of contact in the United States, with authority and ability to cease all emissions, for this operation is the DIRECTV's TechOps team at +1 (720) 565-7415, or Steve Dulac at +1 (310) 429-1624. 6. STA operations must be in compliance with earth station applicable operations allowed by the space station authorization(s) or grant(s), including all relevant conditions, waivers, and findings therein. 7. The Commission recently adopted a new part 100 to replace the part 25 rules that govern space communications. Space Modernization for the 21 st Century, SB docket No.		

25-306, Report and Order and Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking, FCC 26-47 (rel. Jul. 23, 2026)(Space Modernization Report and Order and FNPRM). Those rule changes are not yet effective and will not become effective until the date announced by the Space Bureau via publication of a document in the Federal Register. See id. At para 420. Until then, part 25 remains in effect. However, once these new part 100 rule changes become effective, all space and earth station licensees and recipients of market access must fully comply with them, subject to any and all existing terms and conditions on active licenses and authorizations, unless specified otherwise.

This grant is issued pursuant to section 0.261 of the Commission's rules on delegated authority, 47 CFR § 0.261, and is effective upon release. This STA is authorized pursuant to the Commission's rule 47 CFR § 25.120.
