**Re: Request for Special Temporary Authority
Hagerstown, Maryland Earth Station KA258**

Dear Ms. Dortch:

Intelsat License LLC, as debtor in possession (“Intelsat”), herein requests 30 days of Special Temporary Authority (“STA”),¹ commencing October 1, 2021, to use its Hagerstown, Maryland Ku-band earth station, Call Sign KA258, to provide telemetry, tracking, and command (“TT&C”) services for HYLAS-1² during the satellite’s drift from 159° E.L. to, and on-station at, 80.8° W.L. Intelsat expects to provide TT&C services for approximately six months.³

The HYLAS-1 TT&C operations will be performed in the following frequencies:

- 17302.048 MHz (H, LHCP) and 17305.051 MHz (H, RHCP) in the uplink; and
- 11701.008 MHz (V, LHCP) and 11702.808 MHz (V, RHCP) in the downlink.

All potentially affected operators will be provided with an emergency phone number where the licensee can be reached in the event that harmful interference occurs. In the extremely unlikely event that harmful interference should occur due to transmissions to or from its earth station, Intelsat will take all reasonable steps to eliminate the interference.

transmissions to or from its earth station, Intelsat will take all reasonable steps to eliminate the interference.

Grant of this STA request will allow Intelsat to help the operator of HYLAS-1 safely drift and station-keep the satellite. This, in turn, will help ensure safe space operations and thereby promotes the public interest.
