DigitalGlobe Inc. (“DigitalGlobe”), by its attorneys and on behalf of its predecessor-in-interest GeoEye License Corp. (“GeoEye”), hereby informs the Commission that the satellite earth station under Call Sign E960463 at Newcastle, Oklahoma, licensed to GeoEye has permanently ceased operations. DigitalGlobe acquired the subject earth station following the merger of DigitalGlobe and GeoEye’s parent company in 2013 but never operated the station. *See* File No. SES-T/C-20120817-00761. Please accept this letter as confirmation of the surrender of the license for Call Sign E960463 (File No. SES-LIC-20070508-00569) effective April 28, 2014.
