Dear Ms. Dortch:

IP Network America, LLC (“IP Network”) hereby notifies the Federal Communications Commission (“Commission”) of its intent to discontinue the provision of international services and surrender its two international Section 214 authorizations, issued under File Nos. **ITC-214-20120427-00112 and ITC-214-20130204-00048**, effective immediately. IP Network was granted one Section 214 authorization (ITC-214-20130204-00048) subject to commitments and assurances provided to the Department of Justice in a Letter of Assurances (LOA), signed January 12, 2016. The other authorization (ITC-214-20120427-00112) was issued in August 2012, predating the LOA. IP Network hereby surrenders both authorizations. Concurrent with this filing, IP Network is withdrawing its pending application (File No. ITC-ASG-20181008-00177) for a *pro forma* assignment/transfer of control of its authorization (ITC-214-20130204-00048) to Iboyla Mega Data, LLC.

IP Network does not currently provide international telecommunications services to any customers pursuant to the Section 214 authorizations, and the company is therefore not required to provide notice of discontinuance pursuant to Section 63.19 of the Commission’s rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.19.

We have notified the Department of Justice that we do not provide services subject to the LOA or pursuant to the Section 214 authorizations, and that we intend to surrender the authorizations. Please let me know if you have questions or need additional information.
